- Strategies to hire and train lifestyle coaches
- Strategies to ensure high rates of participant retention during the yearlong program
- Strategies to work with healthcare providers/systems to screen, test, and refer priority populations with prediabetes or at high risk for type 2 diabetes to CDC-recognized organizations
- Strategies to work with employers/insurers to provide coverage for the lifestyle change program
- Program resources and costs needed to start and implement new CDC-recognized organizations in underserved areas
- The facilitators and barriers that impact your ability to successfully implement these strategies

Completion of the evaluation form is estimated to vary between 5 and 7 hours with an average of 6 hours per affiliate delivery site response, and between 3 and 5 hours with an average of 4 hours per grantee response, including time spent reviewing instructions, searching existing data sources, gathering and maintaining the data needed, and completing and reviewing the collection of information.
