10	Describe in further detail any changes to the system that have occurred since the last PIA.	N/A
11	Describe the purpose of the system.	<p>This is a one-time data collection using web-based surveys of adults recruited via targeted social media and web ads using Facebook, Twitter, and Google. The goal of the study is to assess the feasibility of conducting survey-based research on cancer prevention and control using these modes for subject recruitment. Target populations for these surveys include the general population (for cancer screening), cancer survivors, and those at high risk for cancer. If feasible, finding specialized populations for cancer prevention and control research using social media is likely to yield a higher sample size and be more cost-effective than other methods of subject recruitment such as relying on finding these persons in the general population or within a managed care organization. Data will be collected by a contractor to CDC.</p>
12	Describe the type of information the system will collect, maintain (store), or share. (Subsequent questions will identify if this information is PII and ask about the specific data elements.)	<p>The bulk of the information collected in the system will be responses to survey questions related to demographics (race, state, zip code), health, well being, and health behaviors. In addition, survey questions will also address cancer screening, cancer survivorship, and genetic counseling and testing for cancer risk.</p> <p>PII (name and email address) will be collected in order to deliver survey incentives and invite participants to participate in a follow-up survey. IP addresses will only be used to ensure that the same respondent is not taking the survey multiple times. Zip code will be used to create survey weights, but will not be analyzed individually or delivered to CDC by the contractor.</p>
13	Provide an overview of the system and describe the information it will collect, maintain (store), or share, either permanently or temporarily.	<p>The data will be analyzed to assess the feasibility of this mode of recruitment for research. Specifically, statistical analyses will be conducted on the aggregated data to assess the extent of sampling bias associated with surveys using social media platforms as sampling frames and the ability to use weights or other statistical methods to correct for potential biases. Demographic information will enable construction of statistical weights and comparison of findings with surveys of nationally representative populations.</p> <p>The individually identifiable information will only reside at the contractor site and never be delivered or shared with CDC. Participant e-mail addresses, and IP addresses will be deleted by the contractor at the end of the data collection period. Respondent names and mailing addresses will be deleted once all survey incentives have been mailed. Respondent zip code will be used to create statistical weights and will be deleted once the weight variable is finalized. All PII collected will be deleted by the contractor and never sent to CDC.</p>

An individual does not have to complete the survey. The consent form will let the potential respondent know what kind of data is being collected and they have the option to decline participation.

If a potential respondent clicks on an advertisement for our study from a social media website or search engine, they will be taken to a landing page for the study. This landing page contains a consent form that explains our study, the kind of information being collection, and their rights as a research participant. The individual then has to click to consent to continue to one of the study surveys. If they do not consent, they will not be able to participate in the study and no data will be collected on them.

If no process exists, explain why not.	All participants who consent to participation will be given two toll-free phone numbers. The first toll-free number will be provided by the contractor and should be used by participants for assistance with technical issues associated with the web survey or receiving the study incentive. The second toll-free number, will connect participants with the study Principal Investigator (Juan Rodriguez) in the Division of Cancer Prevention and Control at CDC. This number should be used for questions or comments associated with the survey content, or questions and concerns about consent. Concerns about accuracy of PII will be handled by the tell-free number provided by the contractor. Concerns about inappropriate use or disclosure of PII will be handled by the PI at CDC.

There is no process because this is a one-time data collection and PII will be destroyed after being used to deliver incentives and verify no surveys were duplicative.

Staff with access to PII was limited to only study team members and the data files with PII are being saved in secure locations. Only the sampling statistician who is designing survey weights will have access to geographical information. They will not have the ability to link the PII with survey responses to protect identities. IP addresses will only be accessible by those who are ensuring fraudulent data entry. Name, address, and e-mail address will only be accessible by staff who are mailing incentives or sending out reminders about survey participation.
