PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

Authority: The collection of this information is authorized under the Northern Pacific Halibut Act of 1982 and the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act, 16 U.S.C 1801 *et seq.*

Purpose: In order to manage U.S. fisheries, the NOAA National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) requires the use of permits or registrations by participants in the United States. A charter halibut permit (CHP) is required for vessel operators participating in the guided sport fishery for Pacific halibut (charter halibut fishery) in International Pacific Halibut Commission regulatory areas 2C (Southeast Alaska) and 3A (Southcentral Alaska). This annual registration of CHPs will improve the enforcement of CHP transfer limitations and ownership caps, as well as provide additional information to NMFS and the North Pacific Fishery Management Council on any changes in CHP ownership and participation.

Routine Uses: The Department will use this information to identify fishery participants and to determine transfer eligibility. Disclosure of this information is permitted under the Privacy Act of 1974 (5 U.S.C. Section 552a), to be shared within NMFS offices, in order to coordinate monitoring and management of sustainability of fisheries and protected resources, as well as with the applicable State or Regional Marine Fisheries Commissions and International Organizations. Disclosure of this information is also subject to all of the published routine uses as identified in the [Privacy Act System of Records Notice COMMERCE/NOAA-19](#), Permits and Registrations for the United States Federally Regulated Fisheries.

Disclosure: Furnishing this information is required to register a CHP under the Charter Halibut Limited Access Program. Failure to provide complete and accurate information will result in a denial to issue a valid CHP.

APPLICATION FOR ANNUAL REGISTRATION OF CHARTER HALIBUT PERMIT (CHP)**

GENERAL INFORMATION

All Charter Halibut Permits must be registered annually.

Please allow at least ten working days for your application to be processed. Items will be sent by first class mail, unless you provide alternate instructions **and** include a prepaid mailer with appropriate postage or corporate account number for express delivery.

- ◆ It is important that all blocks are completed and attachments provided. Failure to answer any of the questions or provide any of the required documents could result in delays in the processing of your registration request and issuance of a valid CHP.

COMPLETING THE APPLICATION

Affiliation

means a relationship between two or more entities in which one directly or indirectly owns or controls a 10 percent or greater interest in, or otherwise controls, another; or a third entity directly or indirectly owns or controls a 10 percent or greater interest in, or otherwise controls, both.

Indirect Interest

is one that passes through one or more intermediate entities. An entity's percentage of indirect interest is equal to the entity's percentage of direct interest in an intermediate entity multiplied by the intermediate entity's percentage of direct, or indirect, interest in the applicant.

Control includes:

- ◆ Ownership of more than 10% of the entity;
- ◆ The right to direct the business of the entity;
- ◆ The right to limit the actions of or replace the chief executive officer, a majority of the board of directors, any general partner, or any person serving in a management capacity of the entity; or
- ◆ The right to direct the operation of the applicant’s business.

The term "control" **does not include** the right to simply participate in the above actions.
