
U.S. PACIFIC HIGHLY MIGRATORY SPECIES SWORDFISH HARPOON LOGBOOK

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE LOGBOOK FORM

(Please print clearly)

INSERT THE FOLDED FLAP OF THE BACK COVER UNDER THE YELLOW COPY OF THE SHEET BEING WRITTEN ON. This will

prevent the entries from being transferred to the underlying sheets. Keep the yellow copy for your records. Start a new logbook page for every trip. A trip begins when the vessel leaves port to go fishing and ends when the vessel returns to port to sell its catch. Complete one line of the fishing effort section for each fish sighted. Sign and date each original sheet that is submitted.

TOP OF THE PAGE

Enter the Vessel Name, Captain's Name, Coast Guard Document Number or State Marine Board Number (e.g. CF1234AB), Departure and Arrival Ports, Departure and Arrival Dates, and other gears used during the trip (if applicable). A trip begins when the vessel leaves port to begin fishing. A trip ends when the vessel arrives in port and sells its catch.

Landing Information: Enter the port landed, unloading date, pounds of fish unloaded, species unloaded, and record all landing receipt numbers from all sales.

DAILY FISHING SECTIONS

Start a new line for each fish

- 1. DATE FISH SIGHTED: Enter the date for each fish sighted.
- 2. LOCATION (LAT/LONG): Enter the haul location (to the nearest minute).
- 3. FISHING DESCRIPTION: Indicate description with 'Y' as yes and 'N' as no for each fish sighted according to the column description.
- 4. ESTIMATED DRESSED WEIGHT: List the estimated dressed weight of each fish in pounds.

5. COMMENTS: Record any observations related to fishing activities such as number fish seen during the day, discards, movement of fish, water color, bird flocks, temperature "edges" or "fronts", etc.

6. SIGNATURE: Sign and date each page.

SUBMITTING LOGBOOKS

HMS permit holders are required to submit the original, completed logbook within 30 days after each trip to the following address:

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) is collecting this information in support of its implementation of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Management and Conservation Act, the High- Seas Fishing Compliance Act (HSFCA), and the Fisheries Management Plan for Highly Migratory Species. The information will be used by NMFS to assess the status of Pacific highly migratory species stocks and monitor the fisheries. It will be also be used by U.S. negotiators in international and domestic forums to develop policy for the continued harvesting of Pacific highly migratory species. Response is mandatory. The information submitted will be treated confidentially in accordance with NOAA Administrative Orders. The burden for completing a logbook for a fishing trip of 30 days is estimated at 1 hour above that of logbooks kept for normal business practice. This estimate includes the time for reviewing the instructions, searching existing data sources, gathering and maintaining the date needed, and completing and reviewing the collection of information. Notwithstanding any other provision of the law, no person is required to respond to, nor shall any person be subject to a penalty for failure to comply with, a collection of information subject to the requirements of the Paperwork Reduction Act, unless that collection of information displays a currently valid OMB Control Number.
