As required by the government, the SMART service agreement includes a field for the Scholar's SSN because if a SMART Scholar does not fulfill their service commitment to the DoD, the SSN is a requirement for the government in order to initiate debt collection; therefore, it is necessary that the SSN number be provided. Additionally, by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), the SSN is used as an identity credential pursuant to regulations since some of the monies provided to the participants is considered taxable income and therefore, must be reported to the IRS by providing scholars an IRS Form 1099-MISC. The SSN is a required field on the MISC-1099. Therefore, it is necessary that the SSN be provided.

Redaction of SSNs from stagnant archival records protects the sensitive data that is housed in the scholar portal.
