- 4. Do you believe the CW Agencies provide culturally relevant services to your Tribal children and families? If so, can you please give me some examples of what these services were. If no, do you have any suggestions on what type of culturally relevant services would assist your Tribal children and families that are in a CW Agency?**

5. How would you summarize the greatest strengths of the current child welfare program? What are the greatest strengths of your tribal community?

6. In your opinion, what training or technical assistance support would be most helpful to strengthen your child welfare program? Please provide any other comments about your child welfare services and/or training and technical assistance needs.
