GUIDE TO BEAR REPORTING

The National Park Service (NPS) uses NPS Form 10-406, "Glacier Bay Bear Information Management Report" to provide additional information if a bear enters camp, approaches you, damages gear, obtains food, and/or acts in an aggressive or threatening manner. Refer to the back of this page for help in filling out the form. *Please mark the location of any bear sightings made by your group with an "X" and also mark the locations of your campsites with a "C" on the attached maps. GPS locations are especially helpful, please be sure to record the datum in which the points were collected.*



If you encounter dirty campsites left by previous users or observe unsafe or inappropriate behavior by other groups please report this information as well. If you have a serious conflict with a bear such as a bear causing injury to a person, obtaining food, or causing major property damage, call the appropriate phone number listed below on a satellite phone if possible or immediately after returning. The continued safety of future visitors and bears is the responsibility of all users.
