GENERAL INFORMATION

<u>Background</u>.--This proceeding was instituted in response to a petition filed on September 28, 2017, by The Chemours Company FC LLC, Wilmington, Delaware. Countervailing and antidumping duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of these proceedings if the Commission makes an affirmative determination of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce ("Commerce") makes an affirmative determination of subsidization and/or dumping. <u>PTFE resin</u> covered by these investigations is polytetrafluoroethylene (PTFE) resin, including but not limited to granular, dispersion, and coagulated dispersion (also known as fine powder) forms. PTFE resin is covered by the scope of this investigation whether filled or unfilled, whether or not modified, and whether or not containing co-polymer additives, pigments, or other materials. Also included is PTFE wet raw polymer. The chemical formula for PTFE resin is C_2F_4 , and the Chemical Abstracts Service Registry number is 9002-84-0. PTFE resin further processed into micropowder, having particle size ranging from 1 to 25 microns, is excluded from the scope of this investigation.

PTFE resin is classified in the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) under statistical reporting numbers 3904.61.0010 and 3904.61.0090. Subject merchandise may also be classified under subheading 3904.69. The HTSUS provisions are for convenience and Customs purposes; the written description of the scope is dispositive.
