

EXPORT OF LIVE CAPTIVE-BORN ANIMALS AND PRODUCTS/PARTS FROM FOREIGN LISTED CAPTIVE-BORN ANIMALS (CITES)

Note 1: This application can be used to apply for a permit to export non-native live captive-born animals AND/OR parts and products manufactured from such animals from the United States. If you are exporting parts or products manufactured from native-listed species, such as bobcat or alligator, please use form [3-200-26](#) or [3-200-27](#).

Note 2: The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service may not be able to issue documents for the commercial export of Appendix-I species, unless the specimens were produced at a CITES-registered Appendix-I commercial breeding operation. For more information on registering an Appendix-I commercial breeding operation, contact the Division of Management Authority at managementauthority@fws.gov.

If you are **NOT the breeder**¹ of the specimen(s), provide copies of documentation showing that you acquired the animal or parts or products from the breeder (e.g., receipts), documentation demonstrating the history of transactions (e.g., chain of ownership of each animal or product in the form of invoices), and a signed and dated statement from the breeder or breeder's record that clearly includes the following:

PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT
