    invoice or other documents that show you purchased or otherwise obtained the bird from the original importer.
     If you did not obtain the wildlife from the original importer, include documentation demonstrating the history of
    transactions.
  - c. For birds previously imported, provide a copy of your Wild Bird Conservation Act (WBCA) import authorization (non-native birds) or Migratory Bird Treaty Act authorization (native birds).

- 16. If you are applying for a three-year WBCA import permit (i.e., you are a non-US resident traveling through the United States), you must provide a copy of your valid foreign CITES Certificate of Ownership (Pet Passport).
