Neither the manufacture of goods within the institution nor activities related to institutional maintenance are considered classroom instruction.

Title I, Part D funds generated by eligible children in an institution or community day program for neglected or delinquent children or in an adult correctional institution must supplement the number of hours of instruction they receive from State resources.
