Access to restricted-use data requires approval by the authorizing agency. Background

Interview Purpose

Per the Foundations for Evidence-Based Policymaking Act of 2018 (“Evidence Act”), the U.S. Census Bureau, the National Center for Science and Engineering Statistics within the National Science Foundation (NSF), and the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) are developing a standard application process (SAP) and portal for submitting requests for and receiving access to various restricted-use Federal statistics data. Restricted-use data contains sensitive information or information that enables the potential identification of respondents, which is confidential and protected by law. Access to restricted-use data requires approval by the authorizing agency. Researchers currently have to search for and request access to restricted-use data via processes and websites that vary by individual agencies.

In December 2019, the Federal Statistical Research Data Center (FSRDC) program, in partnership with the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research (ICPSR), launched the first phase of ResearchDataGov (RDG). RDG will help streamline the discovery and standard application process for restricted-use Federal statistics data access. Future enhancements that include expanded capabilities are planned for 2021.

Collect information on Researcher needs as it relates to the restricted-use data application process, including future communication and feedback preferences. This will help inform future communication activities to ensure the Research community is aware and knowledgeable about the latest standard application process developments, as well as inform requirements gathering and development efforts planned for 2021.

Data Role and Stakeholder Definitions

Data Role	Definition
Current Data User	Primary customer of the Single Application Process (SAP) who will use the SAP to search for restricted use data and apply for access to restricted use data.
Potential Data User	Other customers of the Single Application Process (SAP) as specified in the law, who may use the SAP to search for restricted use data and apply for access to restricted use
Current Data Owner	Predominantly Federal Agencies who will be making restricted use data available for request, review, and process restricted use data applications via the SAP.
*Potential Data Owner	Other statistical or non-statistical agencies or non-Federal entities who may participate in Phase 2 or 3 of the SAP development process or provide feedback on lessons <i>*Per NCSSES and Census, information on or feedback from Potential Data Owners will not be collected at this time.</i>

Stakeholder Type	Definition
Core	POCs who will be primary users of the SAP, has extensive experience with restricted data access, and would like to be active participants in the Phase 2 requirements gathering, testing, demos, and/or other development efforts.
Secondary	POCs who have a vested interest in the SAP development process and would like to be informed of SAP updates, but not be active participants in Phase 2 activities.
