- 3. A grandparent, grandchild, nephew, niece, uncle, aunt, cousin, or parent-in-law.

Your unmarried son or daughter 21 years of age or older.

> There is no visa category for married children of lawful permanent residents. If you are a lawful permanent resident and you filed Form I-130 for your unmarried son or daughter, but your son or daughter marries before immigrating to the United States or adjusting status to lawful permanent resident, we will deny or automatically revoke your petition.

If you are the lawful permanent resident petitioner and the beneficiary qualifies as:

- 1. Your unmarried children 21 years of age or older,
- 2. Your married children of any age, or
- 3. Your brother or sister (you must be 21 years of age or older),

you are not required to file separate petitions for the beneficiary's spouse or unmarried children under 21 years of age. They are considered derivative beneficiaries and you should list them in Part 4. of this petition.

The derivative beneficiaries described above may apply for an immigrant visa along with the beneficiary.

Who May Not File

- You may not file Form I-130 for a person in the following categories:

 1. An adoptive parent or adopted child, if the adoption took place after the child turned 16 years of age, or if the child has not been in the legal custody and has not lived with the parents for at least 2 years before filing the petition;
- 2. A stepparent or stepchild, if the marriage that created the relationship took place after the child turned 18 years of age; and
- 3. A grandparent, grandchild, nephew, niece, uncle, aunt, cousin, or parent-in-law.
