FTS utilizes a dedicated T-1 secure connection called the CJIS WAN; this connection sends and receives updated fingerprint results obtained bythe FBI-CJIS Integrated Automated Fingerprint Identification System (IAFIS). The search results of the fingerprint images are sent back to FTS and are provided to other DCSA systems that contribute to the overall investigative process. The investigative data associated with those fingerprints is also stored in the Personal Investigation Processing System (PIPS) database d.
