



### FOR EXAMPLE, RECENT SED RESULTS REVEALED:

- Women earned the majority of research doctorates awarded in education, psychology and social sciences, life sciences, and humanities and arts in 2018. Women earned just over one-third of the 2018 research doctorates awarded in physical and earth sciences and nearly one-fourth of the research doctorates in engineering.<sup>2</sup>
- In 2018, about 75% of doctorate recipients who were Asian or white came from families having at least one parent who had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to between 51% and 57% of doctorate recipients who were back or African American, American Indian or Alaska Native, or Hispanic or Latino.<sup>3</sup>
- Sixty-one percent of 2018 research doctorate recipients in life sciences took postdoc positions after graduation, followed by 57% of research doctorate recipients in physical and earth sciences. In other fields, 40% or fewer 2018 research doctorate recipients took postdoc positions.<sup>4</sup>


