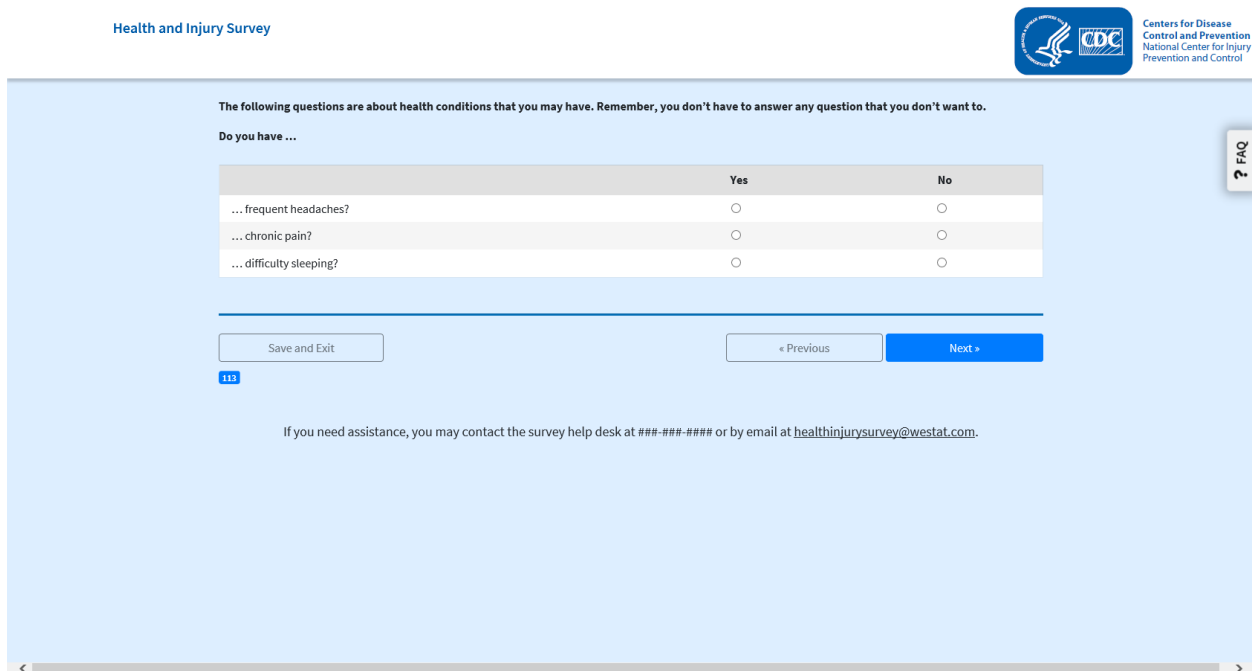

Sexual Harassment and Unwanted Touching section start

Next are some detailed questions about times in your life when you may have ever experienced unwanted sexual situations with anyone, including strangers or someone you knew well, or someone you have known for only a short time. These questions are detailed and the language is explicit, which some people may find upsetting. It is important that the questions are asked this way so that you understand what we mean. Your answers will help us learn how often these things happen. You can skip questions you don't want to answer and you can stop at any time.

Alcohol/Drug Facilitated Rape and Made to Penetrate section start

This next section is about unwanted sex or sexual contact, that is, sexual contact that you did not consent to and that you did not want to happen.

Sometimes unwanted sex or sexual contact happens when a person is unable to consent to it or stop it from happening because they are too drunk, high, drugged, or passed out from alcohol, drugs, or medications. This can include times when they voluntarily consumed alcohol or drugs or times when they were given alcohol or drugs without their knowledge or consent. You might or might not have ever been in this type of situation. Please remember that even if someone uses alcohol or drugs, what happens to them is not their fault.

These questions use detailed and explicit language so that everyone is clear about what the questions are asking.
