- **Premier academic expert in fatherhood involvement:** We are considering Phil Cowan, professor of psychology emeritus at the University of California, Berkeley, and co-director of the Schoolchildren and their Families Project.
- **Barber:** We will be tapping the Fathers Incorporated Atlanta Barbershop Program to identify someone who fits our needs.
- **High School Guidance Counselor:** We will be recruiting someone with with 10+ years of experience in low-income districts to reach young fathers.
