Such producer shall certify that the producer's production of pecans shall be less than 50,000 pounds of in-shell pecans (25,000 pounds for shelled pecans) on average for four fiscal periods(the fiscal period for which the exemption is claimed and previous three fiscal periods) for which the exemption is claimed. Any importer who imports less than 50,000 pounds of in-shell pecans (25,000 pounds for shelled pecans) on average for four fiscal periods (the fiscal period for which the exemption is claimed and previous three fiscal period) for which the exemption is claimed.
