a. Describe the purpose of the information collection or form.

The U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) is renewing Information Collection Request (ICR) titled, 1625-0020: Security Zones, Regulated Navigation Areas, and Safety Zones.

Title 46 U.S. Code (U.S.C.) 70034 and 70051 authorize the USCG Captain of the Port (COTP) to designate security zones in the U.S. for as long as the COTP deems necessary to prevent damage or injury. 46 U.S.C. 70001 authorizes the USCG to prescribe rules to control vessel traffic in areas he or she deems hazardous because of reduced visibility, adverse weather, or vessel congestion. 46 U.S.C. 70011 authorizes the USCG to establish rules to allow the designation of safety zones where access is limited to authorized persons, vehicles, or vessels to protect the public from hazardous situations. Coast Guard regulations for these areas are in 33 CFR part 165.

The collection is used by the Coast Guard to evaluate a Federal, State, local government agency, or owner/operator of a vessel or facility request to establish a Security Zone, Regulated Navigation Area or Safety Zone. If appropriate, a zone is established and advertised via Federal Register publication.

There is no form associated with this collection. The information may be submitted in writing or electronically via e-mail to the USCG District Commander (DC) or Captain of the Port (COTP) at the local Sector Office. The collection is used by the Coast Guard to evaluate a Federal, State, local government agency, or owner/operator of a vessel or facility request to establish a Security Zone, Regulated Navigation Area or Safety Zone.
