USCG is submitting this updated PTA to discuss the Application for Special Permit, Form CG-950A. The purpose of the form (CG-950A) is to document an application for permit to carry an excursion party during a Marine Event of National Significance. The Coast Guard prescribed excursion and special permit regulations in 46 CFR 2.01-45, 26.03-6 and 26.03-8. The form is used by the Coast Guard to determine if the excursion or deviation from a vessel's current operating profile can be done safely. If the Coast Guard determines that the excursion can be done safely, the Coast Guard issues a Permit to Carry Excursion Party.

The form contains vessel specific information and basic business contact information which may include the name and address of the vessel owner/operator, if owned/operated by an individual.

The DHS Privacy Office (PRIV) agrees that this project is privacy-sensitive, requiring PIA coverage because PII is collected from members of the public.

PRIV agrees with USCG Privacy that PIA coverage is provided by DHS/USCG/PIA-008 MISLE, which outlines the risks of capturing information required to support the Coast Guard's marine safety, security, environmental protection and law enforcement programs.

PRIV agrees with USCG Privacy that SORN coverage is not required because information is not retrieved by a personal identifier. Although, SORN coverage is required and provided by DHS/USCG-013 Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE), which allows for the collection of PII from individuals with established relationship(s) and/or associations with vessels, marine transportation facilities, and activities regulated by the USCG.

USCG is required to update the form and use the Privacy Notice attached to this PTA.
