The goal of this project is to assess the training and technical assistance needs of DHP directly funded community-based organizations and health departments. The purpose is to collect training and technical assistance needs in a convenient and easily accessed manner to assist funded agencies to meet their program goals throughout the duration of their funding.

Objective

The objective of the Training and Technical Assistance Needs Assessments is to understand then meet the specific trainings and technical assistance needs directly funded community-based organizations and health departments have as they implement the HIV prevention, care and treatment, and surveillance programs they are funded to provide to their affected communities.
