Awardees are encouraged, but not required, to present their research activities at the symposium as an oral presentation or poster (must be an awardee).

Oral Presentations

Due to the limited number of slots available for oral presentations, speaker preference will be given to those who have not spoken at the symposium before and have awards that have recently ended or are near completion. In addition, speaker selection will seek programmatic balance across science areas and award types. Speaker selections will be made by April 19, 2021, and speakers notified via email.

Oral presentations must be pre-recorded, and the video (mp4 file) submitted to symposium organizers by May 19, 2021. The video cannot be longer than fifteen minutes. If you need help recording your presentation, symposium organizers can assist you.

Your video will be scheduled to play during a set time during the symposium, followed by five minutes of live Q&A.

Poster Presentations

Depending on the number of poster submissions, posters may be selected on a "first-come, first-served" basis. Poster selections will be made by April 19, 2021, and presenters notified via email.

Poster presenters will be given a webpage to feature their work. Text, images, links, and downloadable items can be placed on the page. Presenters may wish to include a short two-minute "elevator pitch" video describing their "poster."

There will be three poster sessions. During your assigned poster session time, you should monitor the text and video chat that will be available on your poster page for questions from attendees.

Abstract and Presentation Guidance

The symposium is unusual in the breadth of the science represented. Abstracts and presentations should be prepared with a broad audience in mind. Please prepare with sufficient background and at such a level that non-experts in the field can readily understand the significance and impact of the research. Please note, when adding co-authors, you are required to provide the co-author's email address. The co-author will not be emailed or notified in any way.
