b The expenditure period for The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) supplemental funding is **September 1, 2021 – September 30, 2025**, which is different from the expenditure period for the "standard" MHBG. Per the instructions, the standard MHBG expenditures captured in Columns A – G are for the state planned expenditure period of July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022, for most states."

c While the state may use state or other funding for these services, the MHBG funds must be directed toward adults with SMI or children with SED

d Column 3B should include Early Serious Mental Illness programs funded through MHBG set aside

e Per statute, Administrative expenditures cannot exceed 5% of the fiscal year award.

f Row 10 should include Crisis Services programs funded through different funding sources, including the MHBG set aside. States may expend more than 5 percent of their MHBG allocation.
