We want you to know that:

- Participation is entirely voluntary and you do not have to answer any question you are not comfortable with. You can stop participating at any time. There is a small risk of discomfort given the personal nature of some question in the interview related to childrearing, marital status, and finances. However, all participants will remain anonymous, and your individual responses will only be viewed by the study. A benefit of participation is your responses will help inform federal grant programming and provide context to complex decisions of youth transitions to adulthood.
- The information we learn from you will be combined with information from other interviews and what we learn will be written in a report. No names or identifiable information will be used. We may use a quote from your interview but will ensure that it does not contain any identifiable information.
- No participants' names or anything you tell us will be disclosed or used, in identifiable form, for any other purpose except as required by law. We have a Certificate of Confidentiality from the National Institutes of Health. This helps us protect your privacy. This means no one can force the study team to give out information that identifies you, even in court. The United States government may still request information for an audit.

We will keep the information that you share with us private. We will only use first names in our discussion, but we will not attribute anything you say to your name or identity. Information from your interview will be combined with many other interviews and included as part of a report.

We will ask you questions about major life milestones, and some additional questions about your responses, and you will type your responses in the chat board.
