AUTHORITY:

PURPOSE:

CBP uses the information provided on this form as a basis for granting relief from forfeiture of seized property or penalty for onsite mitigation. The form must provide a description of the property involved (if a seizure); the date and place of the violation or seizure; the facts and circumstance relied upon by the petitioner to justify remission or mitigation; and if a seizure case, proof of interest in seized property.

ROUTINE USES:
