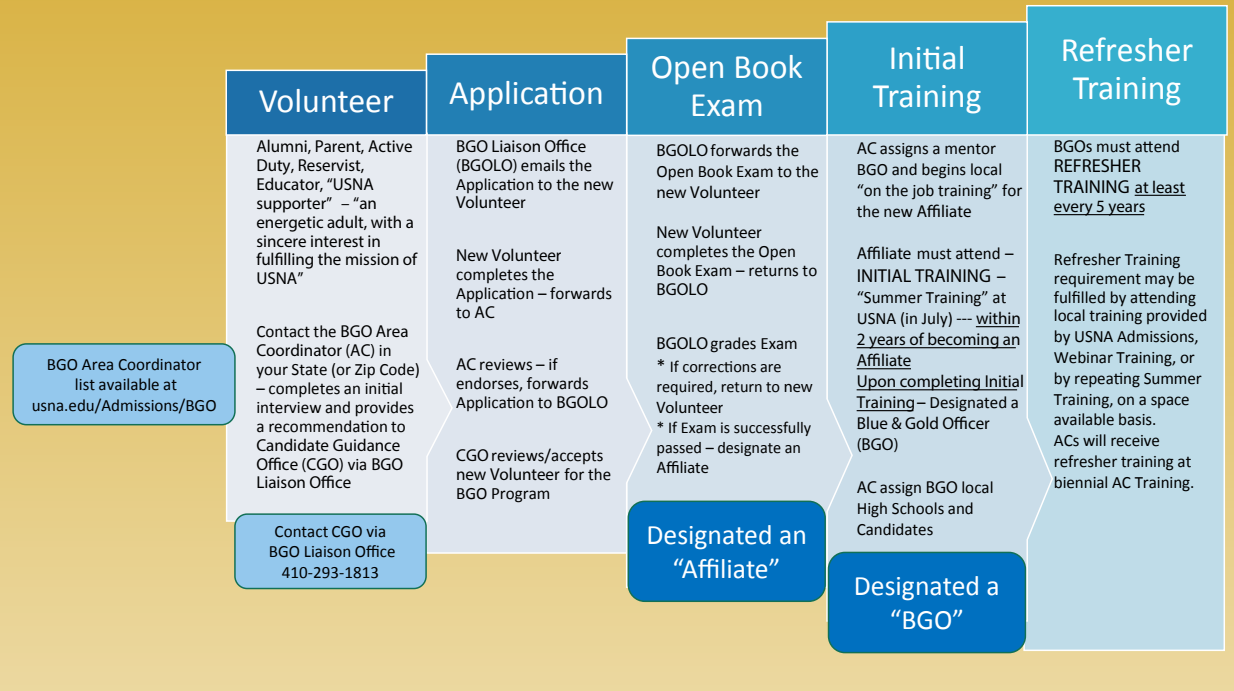
Naval Academy Mission

Process for Becoming a USNA Blue & Gold Officer (BGO)



Become a BGO

1. Contact the Area Coordinator (AC) in your area or USNA Admissions <https://www.usna.edu/Admissions/BGO.php>
2. Complete the BGO Application
3. Complete self study & open book examination
4. Work with your AC and/or mentor BGO
5. Attend formal training at USNA within first two years

Note: For Reservists: Request and receive additional duty (ADDU) orders after qualifying as a BGO
