Instructions:

- 1. Introduce yourself and ensure that tech is working; respondent should be able to access the web survey and share their screen.
- 2. Briefly discuss the goal of the larger survey and the goal of this interview (i.e., to understand how easy or hard these questions are to answer)
 - a. This is YOUR interview. YOUR chance to give important feedback so kids like you can have a better survey experience.
- 3. Remind the student of consent highlights:
 - a. If possible, take the survey in a private location, away from other family members or your parents.
 - b. Information will not be shared and is only used internally without your name and personal information
 - c. You can skip any question. But, if you feel the question is so uncomfortable that you want to skip it, I'll ask you why you feel that way.
 - d. The interview will be recorded, and we will take notes.
- 4. Read the OMB statement:
 - a. We are more interested in what you think of the questions and response choices you will see. We want your honest feedback about what you think about these questions and response choices. We didn't write any of these questions so nothing you say about them will bother us.
 - d. Jump in with comments as you're trying to answer.
- 6. Start with a practice question to make sure they understand how probes work.
- 7. Avoid use or reference to the National Youth Tobacco Survey or NYTS to minimize the introduction of bias.
- 8. After you explain the instructions ask if the respondent has any questions.
