- The remote pilot in command must report any sUAS accident to the FAA no later than 10 days after a Part 107 operation that meet the following criteria: Serious injury to any person or any loss of consciousness; or Damage to any property, other than the small unmanned aircraft, unless one of the following conditions is satisfied: A) The cost of repair (including materials and labor) does not exceed \$500; or B) The fair market value of the property does not exceed \$500 in the event of total loss.
