

Reminder Resolution: Toxic Exposure Screen

VHA Clinical Reminder for Toxic Exposures Version 1.1

As required by the Honoring our PACT Act (Public Law 117-168), VA is screening all enrolled Veterans to help address potential toxic exposures during active service. This screening will occur at least once every 5 years, and if an exposure is reported, the patient will be offered additional resources.

Possible exposures include:

- Burn Pits/Airborne Hazards
- Gulf War related exposures
- Agent Orange
- Radiation
- Camp Lejeune contaminated water exposure
- Other environmental exposures

VA must notify you that this information is being collected in accordance with section 3507 of the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995. We may not conduct or sponsor, and you are not required to respond to, a collection of information unless it has a valid Office of Management and Budget (OMB) number. The OMB control number is 2900-XXXX, and we anticipate that the time needed to complete this survey will average 5 minutes. Information gathered will be kept confidential and private to the extent provided by law. Participation in this screening is voluntary, and failure to respond will have no impact on benefits to which you may be entitled.
