

As required by the Honoring our PACT Act (Public Law 117-168), VA is screening all enrolled Veterans to help address potential toxic exposures during active service. This screening will occur at least once every 5 years, and if an exposure is reported, the patient will be offered additional resources.

Gulf War related exposures

Agent Orange Radiation

Camp Lejeune contaminated water exposure

Other environmental exposures
