Please note that speaker selections for the HRHR Seminar does not impact speaker selection for the June HRHR Symposium.

HRHR is unusual in the breadth of the science represented. Abstracts and presentations should be prepared with a broad audience in mind. Please prepare sufficient background and at such a level that non-experts in the field can readily understand the significance, innovation, and impact of the research.
