Overview	Application for Naturalization		The Application for Naturalization is used to become a U.S. citizen through naturalization, which is the pr you take to voluntarily become a U.S. citizen if you were born outside of the United States.			
			In general, you may be eligible if you can show continuous U.S. residence for three or five years, are at least 18 years old, and demonstrate good moral character and loyalty to the U.S. Constitution. You must also t the English and civics test, unless you qualify for an English language exemption or a medical disability exception.

			Fee	If you are under 75 years old, the application fee is \$725. This includes the \$640 standard fee plus an \$85 biometrics service fee. At your naturalization ceremony, you will return your Permanent Resident Card (Green Card), answer questions about your act: since the interview, take the Oath of Allegiance, and get your Certificate of Naturalization.
