DHS Privacy concurs that the International Anti-Fouling Systems Certificate (CG-6059) is privacy sensitive requiring PIA coverage. DHS/USCG/PIA-008 Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE) captures information required to support the Coast Guard's marine safety, security, environmental protection and law enforcement programs. SORN coverage is not required because information is not retrieved by unique identifiers.
