The Coast Guard issues this form to document compliance with the requirements.

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Records related to CG-6056C are maintained in accordance with NARA retention schedule number N1-026-05-015 and located in the facility or vessel-specific file in the Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE) database.

DHS Privacy concurs that the Various International Agreement Pollution Prevention Certificates and Documents, and Equivalency Certificates (CG-6056C) is privacy sensitive requiring PIA coverage. DHS/USCG/PIA-008 Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE) captures information required to support the Coast Guard's marine safety, security, environmental protection and law enforcement programs.
