<b>Who must comply?</b>	Owners, masters and agents of lightering vessels, and certain facility operators.
<b>What is this collection about?</b>	An owner, master or agent of a vessel must provide the Coast Guard (CG) pre-arrival information in advance of lightering operations. Certain facility operators must notify the Coast Guard in advance of each transfer operation.
<b>Where do I find the requirements for this information?</b>	Title 33 CFR Part 156 is available at— <a href="https://www.eCFR.gov">https://www.eCFR.gov</a> , select TITLE 33 – NAVIGATION AND NAVIGABLE WATERS, and follow to sections 156,118, 156.215 and 156.415-420.
<b>When must information be submitted to the Coast Guard?</b>	For lightering, the information must be provided to the CG at least 24-hours in advance of lightering operations. For advance notice of a facility transfers, the information must be provided to the CG at least 4-hours in advance.
<b>How is the information submitted?</b>	In writing or electronically by--telephone, marine radio, fax or e-mail. Information is submitted to the CG Captain of the Port (COTP) at the local Sector Office. <b>What happens when complete information is received?</b>	The CG will review the information for completeness, and schedule a vessel boarding if appropriate.
