An SRN may consist of a relay-chain of broadcast stations, dedicated wireline facilities, wireless point-to-point or wide area networks, satellite links, internet delivery, or any combination of those facilities or other communication facilities. Not all jurisdictions use SRNs in their EAS monitoring assignments.
