Radiological Emergency Preparedness Tribal Focus Group

We are from the newly formed joint Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Tribal Working Group (FNTWG) and we are interested in getting your thoughts and insights on the topics of most interest or most significant for Tribal Nations who have equities in nuclear and radiation safety and security. In particular, we are seeking your feedback and input on radiological emergency preparedness and response (REP) topics that would be of most interest to Tribal Nations with equities related to commercial nuclear power facilities.

g. Has your Tribal community worked with FEMA's REP Program and NRC? What were some areas that these agencies can improve when working with Tribal Nations? If not, how can each agency bridge the gap and support Tribal Nations?
