Gwichyaa Zhee Gwich'in Tribal Government

Spring/Summer Migratory Bird Harvest Tribal Regulations

(April – August)

1. Tribal Members must ask the Tribal Council or the appropriate staff in writing for permission to hunt/gather during the Spring/Summer waterfowl season in the Yukon Flats area.
2. Requests can be made by Tribal Members only.
3. Participants must abide by all existing State & Federal Regulations in place.
4. Participants must state in their written request for participation who they are hunting for and why. (i.e. Elders, Disabled, Teaching Youth Cultural Knowledge, Food for Family members to comply with Federal Regulations)
5. Participants must report their harvest with Tribal employees when the hunt is over or when they are departing Fort Yukon. (amount/species/abnormalities/observations)
6. Hunt is limited to Gwichyaa Zhee Tribal Lands and adjacent Yukon Flats National Wildlife Refuge Lands
7. Failure to abide by Tribal Ordinances, practices, or any conflict arising with our guidelines can be basis for ineligibility for future hunts. Any future violations will prevent further permission.
8. If you are unfamiliar with Fort Yukon land boundaries/ownership and local knowledge of area and to avoid user conflict, we strongly recommend taking local family members along to help clarify these boundaries and checking with GZGTG staff for maps.
9. A list of names for those approved as "eligible" by the Council to participate in the hunt will be compiled and a courtesy copy will be given to the Executive Director of the Alaska Migratory Bird Co-Management Council and to State Wildlife Troopers and Fish & Wildlife Enforcement Officers by April to avoid confusion about eligibility.
10. An official invitation letter from the Tribe will have to be kept along with hunting license, State and Federal Duck Stamps on person while in the field to avoid conflict.
11. Invitations are only good for the requested hunt season and must be renewed annually.

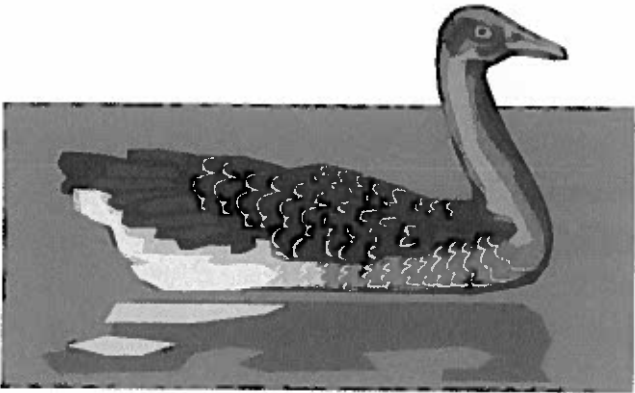

PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

Authority: The Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA) of 1918 (16 U.S.C. 703-712) and the Fish and Wildlife Act of 1956 (16 U.S.C. 742d).
