Title of research study: Truck and Bus Maintenance Requirements and Their Impact on Safety, VT IRB# 23-1050

Key Information: This research is focused on the FMCSA's vehicle maintenance requirements. Proper and regular preventative vehicle maintenance (i.e., systematic maintenance programs) among carriers should be the primary maintenance inspection activity applied to ensure safe vehicle operation. There is currently no supporting definition for what "systematic maintenance" refers to in the U.S. Code of Federal Regulations and, as this term is subjective, it is likely to vary from one carrier to another. This survey will provide important information that will be used to fill gaps in the common meaning of the term (i.e., "systematic maintenance"). Thus, this survey has two primary objectives:

- 1. Collect information to support the development of an operational definition of "systematic maintenance."
- 2. Establish best practices for inspection intervals, mechanic qualifications and training, and certification of maintenance facilities.

Why am I being invited to take part in a research study?

You are being asked to participate as a current fleet representative from a commercial truck or bus carrier that has been identified with low vehicle maintenance violation rates or because your carrier has received an intervention in the last 24 months. We ask that you respond to questions to the best of your knowledge about recommended truck and bus maintenance practices and be willing to express your honest opinions when completing the Carrier Maintenance Management Survey.

How many people will be studied?

We plan to include approximately 289 fleets in this research study.

What happens if I say yes, I want to be in this research?

- You will complete an online survey.
- The survey is an informal discussion where you will discuss your company's maintenance programs and best practices.
- The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration is funding this research.
- The survey is expected to take 45 minutes.
- You may end the survey at any time.
- If you need to take a break or close the survey window, you may continue using the link provided to you to resume where you left off.
- By submitting your responses, you agree to participate.

What happens if I say yes, but I change my mind later?

You can leave the research at any time, for any reason, and it will not be held against you.

Completing this survey is voluntary. Your participation or non-participation will not affect your employment in any way. If after opening the survey you decide that you do not want to answer the questions, you may simply choose not to participate by closing the browser, instead of submitting the survey. However, compensation will be limited to participants who complete the survey.

Is there any way being in this study could be bad for me? (Detailed Risks)

The risks associated with this survey may include possible discomfort at sharing your experiences and opinions. The Carrier Maintenance Management Survey does not ask for your name or any other personally identifying information. Your carrier's name and DOT number will only be linked to your survey responses via a randomly assigned participant ID (i.e. P00105). Any information you provide for compensation purposes will not be linked to your survey responses.

What happens to the information collected for the research?

We will make every effort to limit the use and disclosure of your personal information, including research study, only to people who have a need to review this information. We cannot promise complete confidentiality. Organizations that may inspect and copy your information include the IRB, Human Research Protection Program, and other authorized representatives of Virginia Tech.

One set of de-identified survey data will be permanently housed at Virginia Tech under the supervision of the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute, the organization overseeing the

data collection for the entire study. It is possible that after data collection is complete one copy of de-identified survey data will be transferred to the U.S. Department of Transportation and/or other secure locations as directed by the U.S. Department of Transportation or the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute for permanent storage and oversight. Finally, the de-identified survey data will be posted online for public use after the data collection is complete.

This research project has been approved, as required, by the Institutional Review Board for Research Involving Human Subjects at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University.
