One of the most important uses of these data from the N-SUMHSS is to populate FindTreatment.gov (https://findtreatment.gov), which helps people to seek treatment for substance use and mental disorders in their communities. *Your facility must complete the N-SUMHSS every year to have the option of maintaining your listing on FindTreatment.gov*.
