If you think you have identified an infected plant, report it immediately. To avoid spreading the disease, do not move your plant. Just fill out the form below or call your USDA State Plant Health Director's office.

If you are younger than 18 years of age, please ask a parent, guardian or trusted adult to help you submit your report.

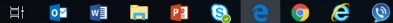

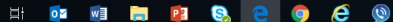
