

## Topics for interviews and listening sessions

### Public Health Law Attorneys

Listening sessions and interviews will be semi-structured and will not include a formal set of questions asked to each respondent. Discussions will be used to identify approaches and barriers to enhancing food safety statutes and regulations in correctional settings.

#### Topics:

- Reactions to differences between food safety laws for correctional facilities and commercial settings
- Experience working with state food safety laws for correctional facilities and commercial settings
- Barriers to changing state food safety laws for correctional facilities
- Opportunities for education and outreach to individuals interested in food safety regulations
