# Column 1 EMPLOYEE COUNT

The total number of persons who worked or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12<sup>th</sup> of the month. Include employees who worked only during the school year but received pay for the whole year.

### Include:

- Counselors, librarians, and coaches
- Custodial and cafeteria employees
- Full-time or part-time employees
- Other non-teaching personnel
- Paid members of religious orders
- Students employed on your payroll
- Teachers, administrators, and trainees
- Employees on active duty, if receiving pay from employer
- Employees on paid sick or other leave
- Employees on paid vacation

#### **Exclude:**

- Outside contractors and their employees
- Pensioners
- School trustees and school board members serving without pay
- Volunteers
- Employees on active duty, if **not** receiving pay from employer
- Employees on leave without pay for the entire pay period
- Employees on strike the entire pay period
