CWBI data table are not directly linked to other USACE data tables for data sharing although data is uploaded to and/or extracted from other USACE data tables; CWBI does not interconnect with any system outside the USACE production environment. System backup is provided using servers located at the processing centers.  The Recreation module in the database includes the following primary personal information: individual's name, height, weight, eye color, date of birth, drivers license number, social security number, telephone number, and vehicle information: tag number, year, make, and color.
