As part of the National Geospatial Technical Operations Center (NGTOC), The National Map Corps (TNMCorps) is crowd-sourced mapping project that relies on volunteers to assist the U.S. Geological Survey's (USGS) National Geospatial Program (NGP) by collecting and editing man-made structures data. A customized online map editor (https://edits.nationalmap.gov/tnmcorps) allows volunteers to collect and update different structure feature types, including schools, fire stations, prisons, hospitals, cemeteries, and post offices, in all 50 states, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. After going through a tiered quality assurance process, the structures data gets incorporated into the USGS' The National Map. This PTA is being updated ahead of the launch of an updated editing application. The fundamental usage and project are the same; the editing application is a new version.

Minimal PII is collected from users. Overall, there is a low risk of harm to the individuals in the event of disclosure. The System Owner must ensure access controls are in place to protect the PII collected. Access to PII should be restricted to personnel who require access in the performance of official duties. If PII data is lost or compromised, it must be reported in accordance with procedures in the DOI Privacy Breach Response Plan (Section 5.0 – Reporting a Suspected or Confirmed Breach of PII. If there are system changes that affect the collection, maintenance, storage, or use of PII, the application will be reevaluated, and the PIA must be updated to ensure compliance with statutory requirements and Federal regulations.
