



Fligibility & Fees Trademark In order to record with CBP you must have a valid trademark registration published on the Principal Register of the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO). The fee for e-Recordation is \$190 per International Class of Goods (ICI, per trademark registration. The recordation will remain in force concurrently with the underlying USPTO registration. The recordation will remain in force concurrently with the underlying copyright registration with the United States Copyright Office (USCOP). The fee for e-Recordation is \$190 per copyright. The recordation will remain in force concurrently with the underlying copyright registration, if renewed with CBP every 20 years. Copyright You may record pending copyright registrations for a period of 6 months by emailing IPRRQuestions@cop data gov and providing proof that you have filed an application with the United States Copyright Office (USCOP). 
A right holder has a 90-day grace period from the time of the USPTO expiration date to renew their recordation. Beyond this 90-day period, should the right holder wish to continue to receive border enforcement, they will have to apply anew and pay the standard fee for new recordations. The IPR Database reflects the expiration date of the CBP recordation, which already factors in the 90 day grace period from the time of the USPTO expiration date.







