

Welcome to the National Saltwater Angler Registry (NSAR).

Most anglers do not need to register through the National Saltwater Angler Registry. If you will be fishing on a private boat in Hawaii, Puerto Rico, or the U.S. Virgin Islands, you will probably need to register with us, unless you already have a saltwater fishing license issued by any of the states. If you are fishing in any other state, or in federal ocean waters more than three mile offshore, you will only need to comply with the state requirements, in which case you will likely need to obtain a state-issued recreational saltwater fishing license or registration. Purpose: In order to manage U.S. fisheries, the NOAA National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) requires the use of registrations by anglers and for hire fishing vessel owners or operators in the United States. For the fishing vessel owner or operator: vessel name, vessel number, primary contact's name, address, date of bith, e-mal address, telephone number, and home port or principal area of operation. Registration information may be used as sampling frames for surveys, as part of NOAA or Fishery Management Council (FMC) analysis to support NOAA and FMC decisions.

Routine Uses: The Department wil use this Information to determine registration eligibility and to identify fishery participants. Discissure of this information is permitted under the Phivacy Act of 1974 (5 U.S.C. Section 525a), to be shared within INMFS offices, in order to coordinate monitoring management of sustainability of fisheries and protected resources as well as with the applicable State or Regional Marine Fisheries Commissions a International Organizations. Disclosure of this information is also subject to all of the published routine uses as identified in the Phivacy Act System Records Notice COMMERCE/NDA41.9, Permits and Registations for the United States Federally Religible of Fisheries.
