Definitions

Thank you. As you may be aware, definitions for *resilience*, *adaptation*, and *sustainability* can vary, and there may even be some overlap. For this survey, we are interested in the ways these concepts are applied in the context of *community planning*. The following definitions, derived from NIST and the American Planning Association (APA), are used:

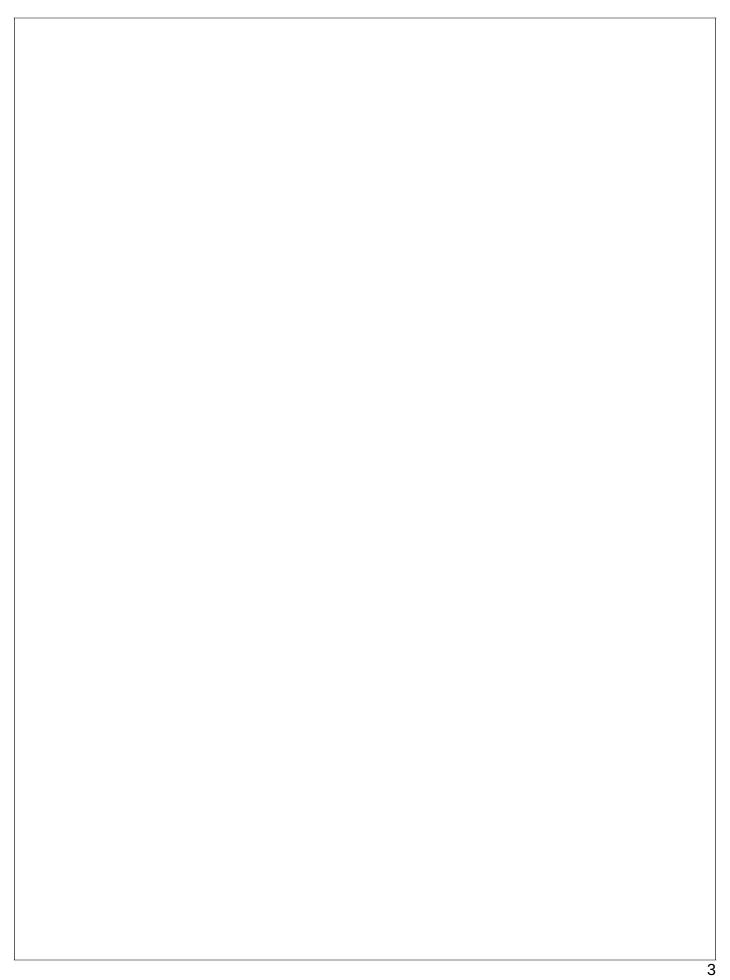
- **Community** *resilience* **planning** includes the processes and actions undertaken to prepare for hazards and changing conditions, and to resist and rapidly recover from disruptions; it may include activities related to disaster preparedness, prevention, protection, mitigation, response, and recovery. For resilience ["R"], think: *prepare*, *resist*, *recover*.
- **Community** *adaptation* **planning** includes the processes and actions involved in modifying the natural or built environment, or behavior, for the purpose of safeguarding human and environmental health, making the community better suited to changing conditions, reducing risks, and preparing for projected impacts. For adaptation ["A"], think: *modify for future conditions*.
- Community sustainability planning includes the processes and actions through which communities meet the needs of current and future generations without compromising the systems upon which they depend by balancing social, economic, and environmental resources, and linking local actions to regional and global concerns. For sustainability ["S"], think: balance resources for the future.

(Note: The hints in blue can be recalled later in the survey by hovering over the <u>underlined</u> phrase in the question text.)
