### LMS Evaluation Study: Marine Corps Survey Overview

- <u>Intent:</u> The intent of the Marine Corps Safety Needs Assessment Survey is to analyze the level of awareness of current LMS programs, references for safety devices and locations, and the place of safety within Marine Corps culture.
