Recipients (as defined in 2 C.F.R. Part 200 and including recipients acting as pass-through entities) of Federal financial assistance from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) or one of its awarding component agencies must complete this tool within thirty (30) days of receipt of the Notice of Award for the first award under which this term applies. Recipients of multiple awards of DHS financial assistance should only submit one completed tool for their organization, not per award.

This tool clarifies the civil rights obligations and related reporting requirements contained in the [DHS Standard Terms and Conditions](#).

Subsequent submissions: After the initial submission, recipients are required to complete the tool once every two (2) years (the 2-Year Update) if they have an active award, not every time an award is made. After the initial submission, recipients are only required to submit updates. If there are no updates since the initial submission, the recipient can indicate "no change" in its responses to the required information in Section 3 of this tool to satisfy the biyearly requirement. Recipients should not re-submit information previously submitted. The due date for submitting the 2-Year Update is calculated from two (2) years from the date the recipient last submitted the tool to DHS. DHS will send an email reminder to the contact person identified in Section 2 prior to the due date for the 2-Year Update.

Subrecipients: Subrecipients are not required to complete and submit this tool to DHS. However, subrecipients have the same obligations as pass-through entities and recipients to comply with applicable civil rights requirements and should follow their pass-through entities' instructions for submitting civil rights information to those entities.

Extensions: The DHS Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties will consider, in its discretion, granting an extension if the recipient identifies steps and a timeline for completing the tool. Recipients should request extensions by emailing the request to CR@hhs.evaluation@dhs.gov prior to expiration of the 30-day deadline.
